



Our role play area this term has been hairdressing, this has centered around our conversational skills, using pictures to support ideas, continuing our money skills and gaining consent.







Oaks Newsletter

This week's focus: Water Safety

We have jointly worked with the Royal Life Saving Society UK on producing some easy read information on water safety. At the Royal Life Saving Society UK (RLSS UK), they work to educate people to enjoy water safely, to keep their families and friends safe and to know what to do in an emergency.

Water can be dangerous. You can drown.

If you are around water, you must follow the water safety code.

Stop and think. Look for dangers.

Stay together. Go with family or friends.

If in danger, call 999.

If you fall in the water, float on your back and call for help.

If you see someone else fall in the water, throw something that floats to them. This can help them.
