Many parents of enjoyed the training not only because they have been able to support their child but because at the end of the training they have had the opportunity to receive an official Signalong certificate for all their hard work.



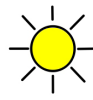

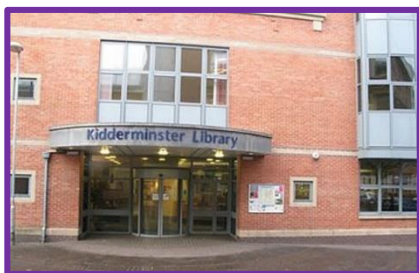
