We are trying to combat pollution at Wyre Forest School – we've given the notices below to all of our transport drivers and passenger assistants. If Parents can join us on this quest it will really help!

IMPORTANT NOTICE

We are trying to do our bit to combat pollution here at Wyre Forest School

PLEASE

Switch off your engine as soon as you are stationary. (this also applies to buses/taxis waiting outside the main gate)

Only start your engine when you are ready to move away.

Do not leave your engine running while waiting for the bus in front to move.

Reminder: 'There is a 5mph speed limit in the school carpark'

This particularly applies to buses, taxis, and other motorists who leave their engines on while waiting outside schools.

The transport department said, "poor air quality is the biggest environmental risk to public health in the UK and every minute, an idling car produces enough exhaust emissions to fill 150 balloons with harmful chemicals, including cyanide, NOx and PM2.5"

"These chemicals can result in a range of health problems that have been shown to be particularly damaging to children".

"Putting a stop to idling is an easy way to drive down dangerously high levels of pollution, reducing its impact on the environment and our health." "Air pollution could contribute to thousands of deaths in the Midlands "
