We have made some changes to our YouTube channel and hopefully now it is a lot more safe and secure to use. If it's not please let us know. As you are aware, this was set up hastily on the 23rd March but already has had over 18,000 hits. Incredible work from an incredible staff team.

You are aware that there is a lot of talk in the media as when schools will reopen and get back to 'normal'. There will be a new 'normal' and as you are aware socially distancing in our school is virtually impossible. We are working on what it will look like, but I have a duty of care to my children and my staff and will not put them under unnecessary risk. I think sometimes it is easy to forget that we have families. vulnerable children, elderly relatives that we need to protect as well. As I have said previously we will not return fully open when schools are allowed to reopen and we will carry out a detailed risk assessment - looking at children's health, what understanding they have, what needs they have including medical etc. Children may not have their normal staffing as many of our staff are shielded or pregnant, they may not be in their normal rooms as we will have to space out the children. It will not be easy! Parents who decide to keep their children at home will actually be supporting us and helping us ease back to the new 'normal' and will in no way be penalised. If you do visit school in the meantime please do not take offence at us insisting on a 2m distance from you. Some parents have not been too keen on this but it is to protect you and us. As we know more I will let you know.

Many of you will be pleased to know we are reverting back to our original distributor of FSM vouchers (WONDE) and will no longer be using the governments voucher scheme. The government voucher scheme has not been easy to set up and many of you have not been able to access your vouchers. Hopefully going forward this will all be sorted. Lyn Cole has worked tirelessly on this, so thank you Lyn.


