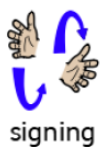

## Communication Tip – Using AAC to Help Children with Routines

**Alternative and augmentative communication (AAC) can help children to understand when they are learning how to follow a routine**



AAC may include using signs, objects, photographs or symbols.

Show the cue when you are telling the child what is happening.





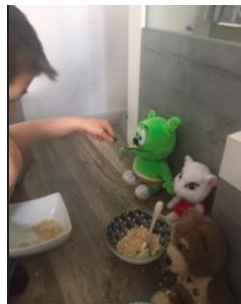
