

More than 80 events will take place in 13 different venues across the city, from Bournville to Library of Birmingham, Longbridge, Yardley Wood and Shard End.







Independent Supporters can be accessed through either Core Assets Children's Services or SEND Family Partnership.

How can an Independent Supporter help me?

- Act as a named contact person throughout the Education Health and Care (EHC) assessment and planning process.
- Help with the transfer from a statement of Special Needs or Learning Difficulty Assessment to an EHC plan. This is called a transfer review.
- Work with parents carers and young people if you are new to EHC referrals or if you have a Learning Difficulty Assessment under the old system
- Liaise across a range of local service and help you to gather the information required for an EHC plan.
- Provide you with information to help you understand personal budgets.

How can I get more information on the Independent Support Service?

- To speak to someone about getting help from an Independent Supporter you can call 0800 028 8455 between 9am and 9pm Monday to Friday, and 9am to 5pm on Saturdays and Sundays. If for any reason you are unable to speak to someone, please leave a message and they will respond to you as quickly as they can.
