


## Newsletter Friday 9th October 2020





A couple of Important Notices for Parents...

It has a host of uses including messages home,

stickers, homework, newsletters, surveys etc We're hoping this will be set up for everyone very soon and I for one can't wait to award my Headteacher stickers out to pupils and explain to parents what they got it for.

Also, we have been using Evidence for Learning in a large part of our school, and this has been particularly helpful in recording progress, especially now P levels no longer exist and the engagement model is to be used <a href="https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/the-engagement-model">https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/the-engagement-model</a> Part of evidence for Learning is that photos and videos of 'learning' and progress against targets with detailed observations can be shared with Parents and Parents will be able to share videos and photos of their child putting what they have learnt into action at home. It's very exciting and you will have a true understanding of just what they are doing at school. We are going to start with Early Years, Russell House and the Complex & Sensory learners and then gradually cascade it out to everyone. I think when you see that residents at Russell House do make their bed, load the dishwasher, load the washing machine, tidy up after dinner etc it will help you, so they can still do this at home!!!
