Lots to share this week.

I am sorry to say we have had to close Bubble 5 (Elm, Willow, Yew & Maple) and Woodlands because we have had two staff (not connected) test positive for COVID-19. Although I am sad we have had to do this, I know you will wish the members of staff well and hope they get better very soon with no complications. It's always a difficult decision but we need to keep everyone safe. Home learning and communication with staff teams will continue. If your child presents with symptoms please get them tested and let us know. The selfisolation ends 21.11.20 and pupils will return 24.11.20. Thank you for your continued support - it really means a lot.

We also had to close Nursery, but this was due to shortage of staff who were looking after their own children who are having to self-isolate. Getting agency/supply staff is very difficult in our school as we have such high standards to keep your children safe, but also, we don't want people who have been working in and out of different schools - potentially spreading transmission.

We've texted and emailed all Parents to say we are moving the INSET day from 18th December to 23rd November. This is so we can use the day for staff PPA and free up staffing towards the end of term if people are absent, and hopefully not have to close any additional classes. Therefore, the last day of term is now Friday 18th December 2020.

School photographs will now be in the summer term. You can imagine trying to do this at the moment is a logistical and potentially catastrophic nightmare. Fingers crossed we will then return to having photographs yearly in the Autumn Term of 2022.



During Lockdown 2 we are continuing not to allow offsite visits and have even stopped our visits to the allotment. We are suffering financially with the increased cleaning etc and the fact we have had to cancel the lettings of the hydrotherapy pool. The running of the hydro pool is very expensive and the letting usually just about cover the running costs, but not this year.
