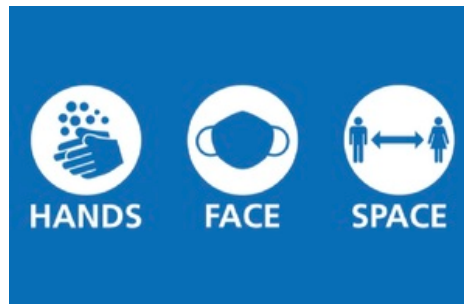

If children bring items home from school, we will leave it up to you how you want to quarantine the items or anti bac them.

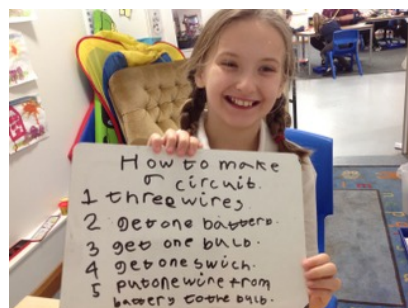
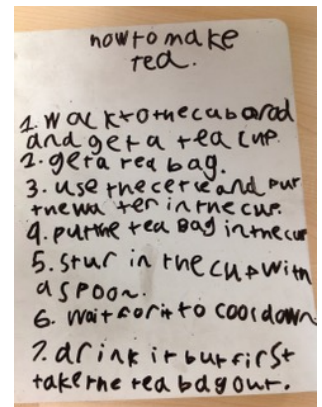

**Please make sure we have up to date contact details for yourself.**

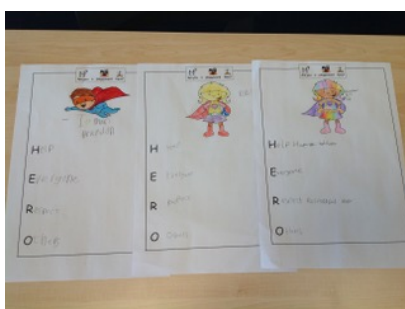
## HAZEL Class

Logan did brilliantly at both the yoga poses you sent and the Cosmic Kids video. Will definitely make that a regular thing!



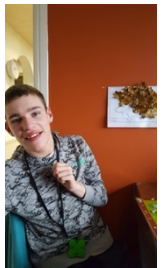
Filip has been joining in with Masha's yoga video on the school YouTube channel, Filip using water in science, Filip doing his very own bake off with his brother, his Autumn garden



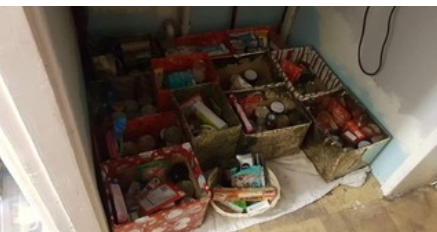
scavenger hunt and Filip matching newspaper captions and pictures as part of our literacy topic. What a Superstar!
