Covid Information whilst school is closed.



Pupils who are symptomatic up to 20th December should arrange for immediate testing and inform the school ASAP (*before* 23rd December) if the result is positive by emailing head@wfs.worcs.sch.uk.

Pupils who develop COVID-19 symptoms and subsequently test positive **on or after** 00.01hrs on Monday 21st December do not need to inform the school but will be required to self-isolate for 10 days and their close contacts will be identified through the national Contact Tracing Service (CTS). There will be no action for the school.

Pupils who will need to continue their self-isolation into the new term should inform the school of their absence in the usual way on the first day back ring the office (Tuesday 5th Jan) and notify us of your absence on 01562827785.

Under no circumstances should any pupil return to school if they are exhibiting any COVID-19 symptoms (however minor) or are **unwell in any other way**. They should arrange for a test and inform the school.

Parents of pupils who are symptomatic at any time should arrange for immediate testing here: https://self-referral.test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/antigen/condition

Self-isolation after a negative test

We are getting reports that some families (when asked to self-isolate as a close contact of a positive case) are getting tested even if asymptomatic. Where a negative result arises, close contacts have been known to stop their self-isolation early. Anyone who tests negative during their 10-day self- isolation period must continue to the end of the isolation period as they can still develop symptoms up to day 10 and become infectious. To support this if there is concern about non-compliance, a school can report to West Mercia Police here: https://www.westmercia.police.uk/tua/tell-us- about/c19/tell-us-about-possible-breach-coronavirus-measures/

Please make sure you are checking texts and emails from school <u>daily</u> as things are happening very quickly at the moment, especially if we have a positive case of COVID-19 (results that may affect the day to day running of the school can come through very late).
