Public Notice on the proposal to increase places at Wyre Forest Special School

I am writing to inform you of the proposal of Worcestershire County Council to increase the number of places at Wyre Forest Special School from 271 to 300 pupils from September 2021. Full information can be found on this link.

A four-week representation period is required following such a notice. The formal representation period will run from Monday 7th June 2021 to **noon on Monday 5th July 2021**.



Children with Disabilities (CWD) Register

We have re-launched our co-produced Children with Disabilities (CWD) register and are keen to get as many families signed up as possible. To do this we ask that you share the information below with families you come into contact with and encourage them to sign up. On signing up to the register the child will receive a certificate stating that they are on the register. This may be able to be used to get discounts at local attractions.

What is the register?

All Local Authorities have a statutory responsibility to maintain a register of children and young people with disabilities who live in their area.

The CWD register is an information database designed to collate the contact details of all disabled children and young people within Worcestershire. The register is voluntary, and information provided cannot be verified.

What we will use the information for?

By registering, families can be kept up to date on service and support within Worcestershire, email addresses obtained via the online form will be used to communicate news and updates with those parent/carers and young people who gave consent to be contacted.

Additionally, the Register is used for statistical information and also helps to keep families involved in the development of new services. It will help us as a Local Authority make better decisions when we are planning and developing services for all families and children.

Why we want people to sign up

Families signed up to the register will receive monthly news and updates from WCF, WCC and partner agencies specifically around SEN/D. This gives us an opportunity to communicate with families, involve them in workshops or focus groups we have planned and get their feedback through surveys. Better communication and involvement of our families and children and young people will strengthen our relationships with them.
















CHERRY Class
