COVID UPDATE - URGENT

Following the Prime Ministers announcement on Monday that social distancing etc will not be removed 21st June, but will continue until at least 19th July, we will not be changing any of our measures in school. We have all worked so hard to keep the pupils, staff and in turn your families safe, that to jeopardise this before the summer holiday would be foolish. In fact, even if the measures are lifted 19th July, we will continue them until we break up 21st July, to give everyone a chance of a happy and healthy holiday. Please remember if you or any of your household are showing COVID symptoms YOU MUST self-isolate immediately and get a test immediately - do not delay.

Unfortunately, this means that our end of year celebrations will be muted and somewhat curtailed. Any events will take place within classrooms, or on their bubble playground and no parents will be able to attend. The leavers party will not be able to take place for this year. Thank you for your continued support - I feel blessed to know that our whole WFS family is behind us.

Our risk assessments will not allow for our traditional transition in 2021, in fact we haven't had a traditional transition since the summer of 2019 and the children came back amazingly in September. We will have transition booklets for those who would benefit from this and each new class team will produce a video that we will put on our YouTube channel - this can be watched over and over again!


