#### **Information for Parents**

- Please remember term ends Wednesday 21st July and starts Monday 6th September and Russell House reopens Monday 13th September. Pupils new to our school in Years 1 to 14 will start on Tuesday 7th September.

10PWG have also been using their skills to make a rather enchanting wildflower area that bees and butterflies will love. As well as some vegetable planters made from pieces of a disused shed.






