Information for Parents



Molly update! Lots of pupils and parents have been asking where Molly is. Molly has a corn on her paw pad which is causing her discomfort if she walks on hard surfaces. It is something that sighthounds unfortunately can suffer from. We are currently waiting for 'boots' for Molly to wear so that it is comfortable to walk on all surfaces again. As soon as she has her new boots she can come to school. The vet is keeping a close eye on it and she's been given some medicine. The big question is what colour boots should

she have? Mr Garratt wants black; I have said red and some of the children have said purple for WFS!!



Unfortunately, COVID is disrupting a lot of schools, particularly in the Redditch, Bromsgrove and Wyre Forest area. We still have a lot of measures in place but would urge families to err on the side of caution and keep your child at home, get a PCR test and let us know the result. As we haven't mixed for such a long time the colds, and bugs are coming back with ferocity. If your child has a temperature they should remain at home and if they are sick or have diarrhoea they should not return to school until 48 hours after the last episode. If too many staff are ill, we will be forced to close classes and we obviously don't want to do this.

Covid Testing at home for pupils:

Latest guidance from the DfE (Sept 27th 2021) suggests that;

"Staff, and pupils and students of secondary school age and above, should continue to test twice weekly at home, with lateral flow device (LFD) test kits, 3 to 4 days apart. There is no need for primary age pupils (those in year 6 and below) to test."

To keep our Wyre Forest family safe, staff continue to test twice a week. Please continue to test your child(ren) at home. When you run out of test kits please let us know and we will send more home. If you are struggling to test at home please let us know.


OAK Class
