Information for Parents – <u>NEW COVID GUIDELINES FOR ALL SCHOOLS</u>



Testing

The Government strongly encourage all those involved in education and childcare settings to continue regular testing (LFT not PCR) and reporting their results, and to encourage pupils and students in year 7 (aged 12+) and above to test and report their results.

We have also been told to ask Parents, Guardians and other visitors to take a lateral flow test (LFT) before entering our school.

Isolation

All individuals who have been identified as a close contact of a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19, irrespective of vaccination status and age, will continue to be required to self-isolate and asked to book a PCR test.

Cases within a class

Where there is a suspected case of COVID in a class, we will inform you of this. Where there is a positive case of COVID we will be treating the class as a 'household' and will temporarily close the class and ask everyone, staff and pupils, to get a PCR test and let us know the result. If we have safe staffing levels we will reopen. Where pupils are not able to take a PCR we will ask that you self-isolate for 10 days. We need to take these actions to stop the spread around our school and protect any vulnerable pupils and staff.

When getting a PCR test, we recommend you go to a test centre as the results come back quicker than if you post them.

Boxes of test kits will be sent home to all Secondary aged pupils today. If any Primary aged pupils would like to request a box to be sent home, please let the office know.

When we return in January, where we already have consent from parents, we will be lateral flow testing pupils first thing on Wednesday morning. Parents will be informed of results by text. If there are any positive cases, we will contact parents to pick up your child straight away.

I know this is so inconvenient and challenging and I thank you all for your unwavering support. WFS will play their little part in the prevention of the transmission of COVID.

Thank you so much for all the positive comments regarding keeping the school open following the fire at Hoo Farm. We do, wherever possible, try and keep open and take the information given to us from Worcestershire Children First to inform our decisions. We would, obviously, always put safety first but due to the fire being some distance away we could ventilate due to Covid whilst using the CO2 monitors to help us. Given the disruption to schooling and the impact this has on your own jobs we will only close in exceptional circumstances eg: unsafe staffing due to COVID. We will also always contact you via text if we are closing - please keep your mobile contact numbers up to date.

It's been a tough term; COVID, fire(s), floods - lets' hope that's it now and we can enjoy the last few days at school and have a healthy and happy Christmas! Again, having the support and backing of our families is never taken for granted - we really do appreciate it, and to use a rugby expression, you are my '16th man'.

It is with great sadness that we say goodbye to two members of staff this week. We say goodbye to Cilla M. Cilla has worked at WFS and previous to this Blakebrook, for many, many years. Her commitment to the children and families has been unwavering and she will be sadly missed. We also say goodbye to Gemma J who starts her maternity leave, but will soon have 3 small children at home and has decided to take a career break whilst she focusses her time on them. Although we understand this totally, we will indeed miss her but I'm sure she won't have time to miss us!!

We also welcome Charlotte Y to the staff team and hope she settles and enjoys being part of the WFS family.

Over Christmas staff will be testing twice weekly and will test before returning to school on Wednesday 5th January 2022. We would welcome those pupils who can test to do the same, and test before returning to school.. Testing is really helping us stay as COVID free as possible and alongside vaccination, ventilation, hand and respiratory hygiene and the wearing of mask in communal areas, we are certainly seeing a decrease in numbers. Fingers crossed that it remains that way.
