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Information for Parents



What another busy and exciting week at WFS, with the ongoing challenge of poorly staff and pupils. The staff have all tried to keep as many classes open as possible and worked tirelessly to do this for which I am very grateful. Where it is just not safe to open, we have had to make the very difficult decision to close. The staff and children have been quite brilliant this term with the inconsistencies we have had to endure.

As we look towards the Governments 'Living with COVID-19' plan we will no longer be wearing masks in school and there is no need to test twice weekly for COVID. Once we have distributed the last few testing kits we have, we will not be getting any more kits. The advice is if your child is unwell to keep them off school until they are well again. If we have an outbreak, we may be advised by the Local Outbreak Response Team (LORT) to bring in more measures again. We will continue with the hand and respiratory hygiene and ventilation.

Unfortunately, we have some children who have mobile phones and, out of school hours, are using them inappropriately. We talk to these pupils and their parents but as you can imagine we are unable to police their actions all day, every day. Please regularly check and monitor your child's phone, and if there is inappropriate content let us know and we can follow it up with the parents of the child who is sending it. Please also block the numbers so they cannot receive anything from that child again. Children at WFS DO NOT have their phones on their person during school hours and if they do will have them confiscated and parents will be required to collect them in person. Where we have repeat offenders and we have exhausted all our powers, we will be passing this onto the police as harassment. We are getting extremely fed up with this ongoing problem and would appreciate the support from everyone to try and stop it escalating even further.



As parents will now be aware, we have employed the services of Relish School Food in the delivery of our catering service, Relish are a local fresh food company and are working with the school on the bigger project of re-instating our school kitchen, this will allow us to offer a range of fresh, wholesome and tasty food cooked by our own catering team.

Currently Relish have introduced a new host kitchen where our food is prepared, cooked and transported, over the last few weeks we have seen a significant increase in the numbers of children choosing to eat the school lunch which we think is down to the improved quality.

Exploring different ways that seeds disperse and travel has been our favourite activity. The pupils put seeds into balloons to make exploding seed pods, made helicopter flying seeds and experimented with ways to move seeds using water. When we popped the seed pod balloons it was exciting to see how far the seeds travelled from the explosion and on the wind. We dropped our helicopter seeds from the top of the stairs and watched them spin to the ground floor and everyone was excited to have a go at moving the seeds (balls) using squeezy water bottles.
