Information for Parents



It has been a very hot but lovely few days attending different school events and seeing lots of parents. It was lovely to meet the new reception parents in person rather than via zoom!! Hopefully next academic year we can do even more activities with parents and no further pandemics! However, we are having an increase in COVID cases and a significant number of children with sickness & diarrhoea. PLEASE if your child has Covid symptoms keep them off for at least 3 days and of they have had sickness, diarrhoea or loose bowel movements they must be off school for 48 hours following the last episode.

Unfortunately, where pupils have been ill and sent in, staff have then picked up the bugs and that causes issues for the class to remain open. It is incredibly difficult but we need to look after each other.

I took the decision, along with the Chair of Governors, to close the school early Monday & <u>Tuesday, in good time to give families time to plan. Thank you for the families that have already</u> <u>notified me that they are keeping their child off school on these days. Children will have their</u> <u>lunch and then be on transport at 12.30pm before the highest temperatures.</u> Despite the age of the building, our school is certainly not built for these temperatures but we will be looking at black out blinds and more shade for next year if the budget allows. We do not have air conditioning and it would be too expensive to install unfortunately.

Please can I remind parents that staff will not respond to emails in an evening or at a weekend, and they will not be responding to emails over the summer holidays - they have their own families to care for. If there is something you need to contact school about please email <u>office@wfs.worcs.sch.uk</u> this will be checked weekly over the holidays and responded to. If it is about holiday club then please contact Lotte Tvede directly.

This is the last newsletter before we break up for summer next Thursday and pupils return Wednesday 7th September. Can I thank you for your support this year as we have begun to get back to a more normal school year and here's hoping that 2022 - 2023 will have no bumps in the road!
