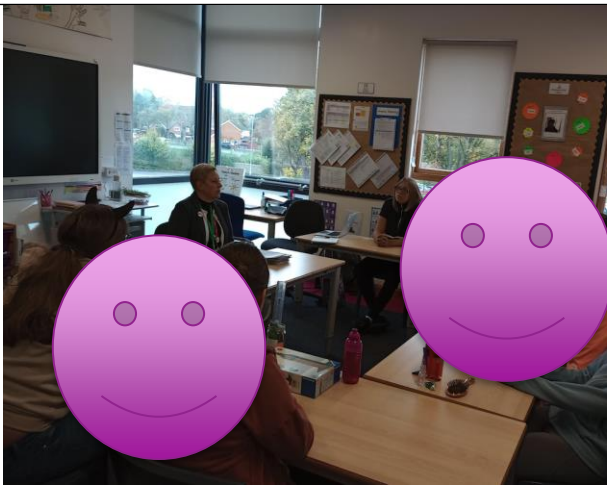

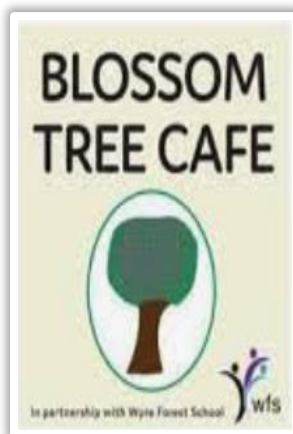

Fireworks Safety Tips: If You Choose to Use
Legal Fireworks

**Never allow young children to handle
fireworks.** Older children should use them
only under close adult supervision. Never
use fireworks while impaired by drugs or
alcohol. Anyone using fireworks or standing

nearby should wear protective
eyewear.



Firework safety



Do This, NOT That

- ✓ Keep water nearby in case fireworks start a fire.
- ✗ Don't point fireworks at pets.
- ✓ Wear eye protection if you light a firework.
- ✗ Never try relighting a dud.





FOLLOW THE FIREWORK CODE

If you must have fireworks at home, please follow this safety advice.

| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Only buy fireworks from retailers registered with MFRS• Keep fireworks in a closed box• Follow the instructions on each firework• Light them at arm's length, using a taper• Stand well back• Always supervise children around fireworks• Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves• Keep pets indoors | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks• Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode• Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them• Never give sparklers to a child under five• Don't let fireworks off after 11pm |



Firework Safety

- Fireworks should not be touched
- You must always be with an adult when watching fireworks
- Stand far back from both fireworks and bonfires
- Once a firework is lit, never go near it
- If an adult allows, always wear gloves when holding a sparkler
- Pets should stay indoors



Fireworks Safety Tips

- ★ Never allow **children** to play with or ignite fireworks.
- ★ **Never** try to **re-light** or **pick up** fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- ★ Keep a **bucket of water** or a **garden hose** handy in case of fire or other mishap.
- ★ Make sure fireworks are **legal** in your area before buying or using them.
- ★ Light fireworks **one at a time**, then **move back** quickly.
