



Never throw fireworks Keep pets indoors

Keep fireworks in a closed box Always wear gloves when handing sparklers stand well back never go back to a lit firework

Fireworks Safety Tips: If You Choose to Use Legal Fireworks

Never allow young children to handle fireworks. Older children should use them only under close adult supervision. Never use fireworks while impaired by drugs or alcohol. Anyone using fireworks or standing

nearby should wear protective evewear.

- Fireworks should not be touched
- You must always be with an adult when watching fireworks
- Stand far back from both fireworks and bonfires.
- Once a firework is lit, never go near it
- If an adult allows, always wear gloves when holding a sparkler
- Pets should stay indoors



#### FOLLOW THE FIREWORK CODE

If you must have fireworks at home, please follow this safety advice.

#### DOs 🗹

 Only buy fireworks from retailers registered with MFRS Keep fireworks in a closed box

· Follow the instructions on each firework

· Light them at arm's length, using a taper - Stand well back

Always supervise children around fireworks

· Light sparklers one at a time and

wear gloves

#### DON'Ts 🔀 - Don't drink alcohol if setting off

fireworks Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode - Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them Never give sparklers to a child under five

- Don't let fireworks off after 11pm

Keep pets indoors

# **Fireworks Safety Tips**

- \* Never allow children to play with or ignite fireworks.
- \* Never uy to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- \* Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of fire or other mishap.
- \* Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or using them.
- ★ Light fireworks one at a time. then move back quickly.
