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Information for Parents



Another busy week has flown by at WFS. Huge apologies to NURSERY and ACORNS Reception families for the closure. This was due to blocked toilets and issues with water. Unfortunately, we do not own or have keys to do maintenance of the Early Years Hub as it belongs to St Johns. Their site manager was on holiday, and we had no way of sorting the issue out. This, as you can imagine, is incredibly frustrating as both John and Steve our site staff would have sorted it within hours!!



Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of Wyre Forest School,

We need your help! We are now, unlike many schools, fully staffed, but as and when staff are poorly, we are struggling to get agency staff to fill the gaps. This puts pressure on classes and the staff.

We are looking for Parents, Carers, Aunts, Uncles, siblings aged 16 and over etc to join our 'Casual Supply' team. This would mean we would call you in a morning (around 8am) and you would let us know if you could or could not work that day. We would need you in by 9.15am and the day would finish at 3.10pm (or earlier by negotiation).

You would get paid as a Grade 1 Teaching Assistant which is £11.68 an hour.

You do not need any formal qualifications, just a willingness to join our team, an understanding of the importance of confidentiality and an openness to learn. You need to come as a member of the WFS team and not as a mom or a dad! Many of our Casual Staff are taken on as full-time staff when positions become available.

If you are interested in joining our 'Casual Supply' team, please email Tracey Birch tbirch@wfs.worcs.sch.uk to express an interest. We will then send you an application form, arrange a short interview/chat, process your paperwork etc You will also have an enhanced DBS check carried out. This is the **most detailed and in-depth criminal record and barring check that can be carried out in the United Kingdom** because keeping our children at WFS safe is paramount. If you think you would like to join us to do as little or as much casual work as we can offer, PLEASE get in touch. We are also looking for additional lunchtime playworkers (1 hour a day) to work over lunchtimes – again if interested contact Tracey Birch tbirch@wfs.worcs.sch.uk

If 18 or over, Parents will need to decline the nasal option which will then bring up the injection consent for them to complete.
