As you all know, places for our school are in huge demand and we currently have 310 pupils. From September, we will be taking

over the whole of the EYFS Hub from St John's (which we will rename) and expanding by a further four classes. The places for these classes have already been filled by Worcestershire Children First (WCF) with the most complex of learners and we are looking forward to welcoming them and their families to the WFS family.



We are also increasing the number of places we have in reception to 30, and there will be some building work in the summer holiday to accommodate this.

At the end of this term, I will have been headteacher here for 8 academic years and we will have doubled in size, but everyone still comments on the lovely family feel to the school, the fact we know all our children as individuals and the high standards we place on ourselves every day. 
