
Information for Parents














LARCH Class

Pear Class have worked hard in science this week organising various packaging into correct material categories such as cardboard, metal and glass. Well done Pear Class!






Flu Vaccination – Catch Up

Communication Team News

Hi everyone,

Here's a Communication and Interaction top tip for this week: Listening and following instructions are key skills in becoming a good communicator.

Hide and seek provides lots of opportunities for children to attend and listen to what you are saying. Hide and seek also gives children opportunities to follow and give instructions.

How to play:

- Ask your child to choose a toy or teddy.
- Tell them we are going to play hide and seek together. This means teddy is going to hide and we must find him.
- Model putting your hands over your eyes together. Tell your child you must listen for 'I'm ready!' then you can then open your eyes.
- When the child is looking for the teddy, you could help your child by saying, 'Where is teddy? Yes, you have found Teddy! Teddy was under the cushion!'
- On the next turn, your child could hide the teddy and you have to find it ③
