Hi everyone,

Here's a Communication and Interaction top tip for this week:

Listening walks are a wonderful activity for building attention and listening skills.

They provide an opportunity for children to explore and learn from listening and to see how many things they can notice when they are focussing their attention.



- Go on a walk outside
- Say, 'Have our ears ready to listen and our eyes ready to look for clues'
- Cup your hand around your ear and say things like, 'Can you hear the birds?' 'Can you hear the rustling of the leaves?' 'Can you hear the car?'
- Encourage your child to identify the sounds they hear
- Try visiting lots of different places on your



listening walks

thoroughly enjoyed it.


















YEW Class
