Our number one priority is to keep the children of WFS safe, and a lot of our children are nonverbal and cannot tell us how it has happened. 9 times out of 10 it is a normal childhood bruise, and a quick easy explanation can be given. Without us doing this we may miss that child who does not have an accidental injury and unfortunately it does happen. We therefore will continue our safeguarding procedures.
