This week Mrs Phillips organised yet another amazing World Book Day and the children (and staff!) looked amazing - well done everyone.


Every Wednesday Molly the school dog hears readers and we have been blown away by the progress the children have made with their reading.

#### **OLIVE Class**




#### **OAK Class**
