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Information for Parents



Another week and another newsletter packed with exciting learning.

This week we have taken part in a 'Dress Funny for Money' for comic relief and lovely activities organised by Rosie Thorpe. Everyone looked fantastic - well done.

As mentioned in other newsletters, we are not running Holiday Club this Easter and following a Governors meeting the decision is not to carry on with holiday club. The club was actually running at a deficit even with grants and this is money needed for the education of the pupils. The percentage of pupils using the club was small and had been decreasing over the years. The wages for staff doesn't cover childcare that they have to find in order to be here. We are continuing to try hard to find a private provider to run a holiday club and we will continue to signpost to other activities and clubs. This is incredibly sad but also a sign of the times and we have done well to manage to keep this going for as long as we have.

The Government are introducing wraparound care for all primary age pupils by September 2026, and we will be working with the Local Authority on this. Currently the guidance is very sketchy and doesn't mention special schools. I will of course keep you posted on this.

Free School Meal Vouchers - eligible parents/carers will receive their vouchers on Wednesday 20th March.

HOLLY Class



Advice to Promote Early Language Development

Learning New Words

Modelling language. This means to demonstrate. If your child is not using words, you can interpret what they are trying to say and model the word for them to hear. This will help your child learn the word that goes with the object or action e.g.

- Action words (e.g., walking, running, jumping)
- Describing words (e.g. big, heavy, red)
- Naming words (e.g. pencil, ball, bag).

You can do this by labelling objects, pictures or actions that interest your child e.g., when your child is looking and reaching for a ball you could say and sign "ball... a big ball".
