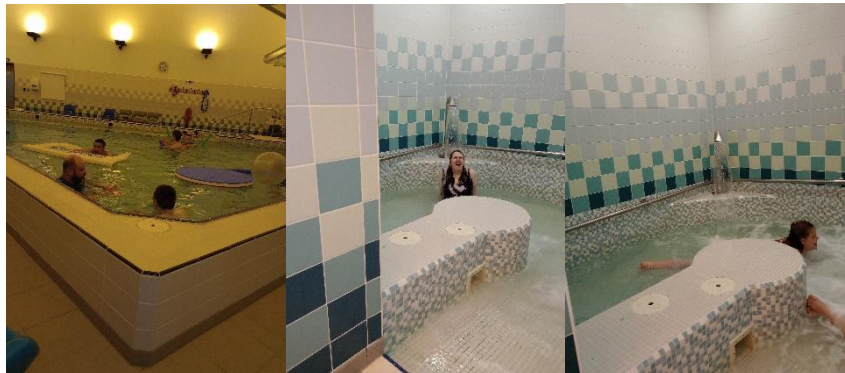
Youth Club

Our Way

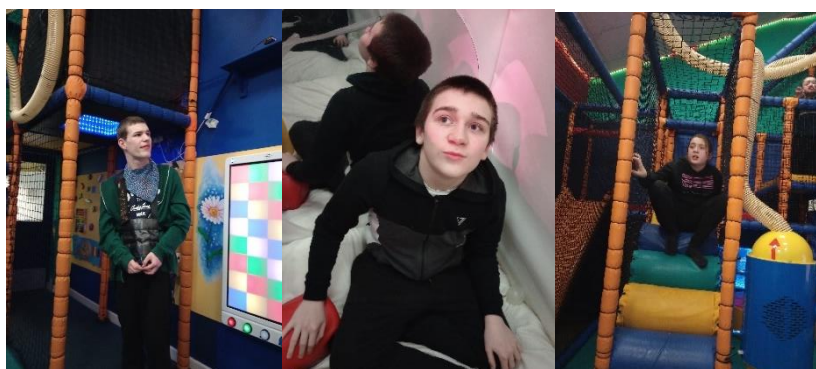

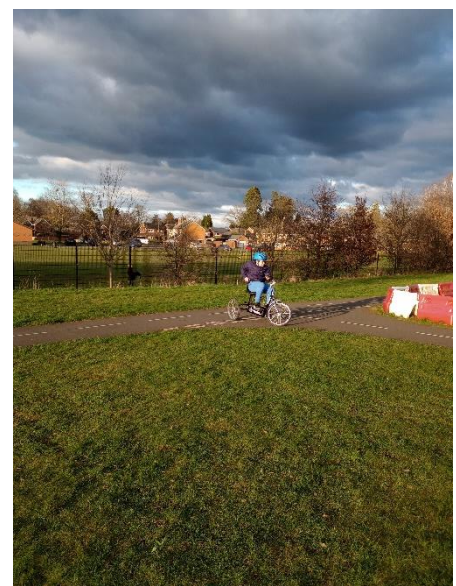
Arcade
