Music therapy is the use of sounds and music to help the children have a better understanding of their emotions and how these can impact on their behaviour. I do this by encouraging the children to explore and play on the available musical instruments. They don't need to have played an instrument before to do this. I use the music I make to acknowledge and support the emotions the children are

expressing. Through this the children become more aware of their feelings and the effect they can have on how they interact with others. Outside of school I enjoy playing drums in a rock band and looking after my own two little children. This keeps me fully occupied! 
TIP OF THE WEEK from the Speech and Language Team:



If you're teaching comparisons, make sure you have at least three items to compare. Comparatives can be a real challenge e.g. tall...taller...tallest. If you use 2 items then children can use the concept: big and small but if you use 3 or more items they need to use a comparison e.g. big...bigger...biggest
