Medication in school

TIP OF THE WEEK from the Speech and Language Team:

During times of transition; record questions/answers to help reduce levels of anxiety.

Children who are anxious about transitions often need LOTS of reassurance. Just hearing the answers to their questions once may not be enough. Provide a visual timetable- see resources (e.g. plan for my day) or try making a book of their questions. Write the answers in together so they can read it as many times as they need to.
